Student Growth – Multiple Measures

Type of Measure: <u>Direct service articulation</u> <u>students</u> will use a Speech Articulation Measure — Compare number of errors from the beginning of the year (or initial evaluation) to the end of the year (or end of treatment if exited before end of year).	Type of Measure: Direct service non-articulation students (language, and/or voice, and/or fluency or other students) Will use progress reports. Students will advance at least one level on a (0-5) scale on at least one of their speech/language goals.	Type of Measure:
Decrease in errors as measured by the Goldman Fristoe Test of Articulation (or other standardized artic test) = growth	Advancement on goal or reduction in # of goals = growth	
Growth Ex. 31/34 articulation students, 91%, exhibited fewer errors from the beginning of therapy to the end of therapy and showed growth	Growth Ex 29/31 of my speech/language students, 94%, demonstrated growth by advancing at least one numeric level on at least one of their speech or language goals.	Growth
