State of Michigan Updates:

The 2025-2026 Legislature is in full swing and both the MI Senate and House are busy working on state budget appropriations.

Currently, the Senate School Aid Appropriations bill (<u>SB 230</u>) calls for up to \$20,000,000 in 2025-2026 for LETRS (Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling) professional learning for educators in pre-K, kindergarten, grades 1-3, and additional elementary school educators and pre-K to grade 12 certificated special education personnel with endorsements in learning disabilities, emotional impairments, or speech and language impairments.
