Test Anxiety



According to ASHA, test anxiety is one of the top causes of low Praxis scores...

"Some test-takers become overly anxious, causing them to forget content, guess wildly, or lose concentration.."

My Tips for Combating Test Anxiety

- •Prepare by familiarizing yourself with the test format, testing environment, and utilizing prep materials
- •Do a "dry run" of the drive to the testing center/parking lot
- •Hydrate and have a nutrient rich meal/snack before the exam
- •Get a good night's rest before, and days leading up to, the exam

The Praxis: Overview

Who

•YOU and anyone else working towards their CCCs and licensure

What

- Comprehensive, online exam containing questions from three content categories (e.g., Foundations, Evaluation, and Treatment) across the "Big 9" resulting in 132 total questions
- ${ullet}$ 150 minutes (2.5 hr) to complete the entire test.
- •The testing format relies on multiple choice/select response style questions

The Praxis: Overview

When

ETS recommended that "individuals register and take the Praxis exam **no earlier** than the completion of their graduate coursework and graduate clinical practicum or during their first year of clinical practice following graduation, to better ensure that they have the knowledge base to pass the Praxis exam."

Why

- · Licensing requirement in the state of MI, alongside completion of CF and graduation from an accredited master's program
- Scores are reported on a 100-200 score scale in one-point increments.
- The required score for ASHA and the state boards of examiners is 162

Additional Information

- Ensure that the name you use to register on the ETS website matches the name you will have on test day as it appears on your identification
 - If the name shown on your primary identification does not match the name on your registration record, you will not be permitted to test

You must have acceptable and valid ID with name, signature and photograph to be admitted to a test center

Acceptable forms of primary ID include:

Passport with name, photograph and signature

Passport Card (United States only – must be accompanied by valid supplemental ID)

Valid government-issued driver's license with name, photograph and signature

State ID issued by a motor vehicle agency with name, photograph and signature

National ID with name, photograph and signature

Military ID with name, photograph and signature



- •Have confidence in your education; you've made it this far for a reason
- •Review your comprehensive notes from across the Big 9
 - hearing; fluency; voice, resonance, and motor speech; speech sound production; social aspects of communication, including pragmatics; feeding and swallowing; augmentative and alternative communication; receptive and expressive language; and cognitive aspects of communication

Preparation: Test Day

During registration, you may identify **up to four** institutions or licensing agencies to receive your *Praxis* scores **for free**.

- •For ASHA certification, exam results must be sent directly to ASHA from ETS (Code: R 5031).
- •It is recommended that you have your score sent to your academic institution (e.g., for Western Michigan University, Code: A 1902)

Testing Environment

Computer Based Testing Center

- ·Wear Comfortable clothing
 - Leave non-sentimental jewelry at home
 - Limit number of pockets if possible
 - Wear closed toed shoes (I do not recommend flip flops)
- •Signing In
 - · Provide your identification
 - Verify test (5331)
 - Use the restroom (breaks are allowed if necessary)
 - Store personal belongings in locker (free)
 - Security check (metal detector, show ankles, BTE)
 - · Picture and signature
- At your desk
 - Computer, OTE headphones, pencil/paper



Scoring

Prior to reviewing your unofficial score, you the option to report or cancel your score. Once you have chosen to report the score, it cannot be canceled.

Raw (Unofficial) Score

- •Appears on the screen after the exam (Foundations, Evaluation, and Treatment)
- •Raw points awarded equate to the number of correct answers

Scaled (Official) Score

- •Computed from your total number of raw points in a way that adjusts for the difficulty of the questions
- •100-200 scale

Note Only questions answered correctly count toward your score. It is better to guess than leave an answer blank.
