State of Michigan Updates:

SB 230 calls for up to \$20,000,000 in 2025-2026 for LETRS (Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling) professional learning for educators in pre-K, kindergarten, grades 1-3, and additional elementary school educators and pre-K to grade 12 certificated special education personnel with endorsements in learning disabilities, emotional impairments, or speech and language impairments.

<u>SB 180</u> maintains unit rates in effect from FY2020 for medical consultants performing disability determination services, including SLPs.

<u>HB 4484</u> modifies coverage policies for SLPs.



The most recent Medicaid Therapy Provider Liaison meeting was held by MDHHS on July 15, 2025.

Therapy Provider Liaison meetings are an opportunity to review Medicaid policy updates and FFS procedural changes or provider concerns in an open forum.

Meeting minutes, Q&A, and PowerPoint slides from the meeting are available on the MDHHS website.

The next meeting is anticipated for early 2026.

We zoom monthly for an hour to tackle our agenda items. Virtual meetings alternate between lunchtime and after school timeframes.






